

Criminal Convictions that Cannot Be Sealed

- Any **first or second degree felony** or any offense with a **mandatory prison term**;
- Any **first degree misdemeanor or felony** offense where the **victim was under 16 years old** except for **non-support of dependents**.
- **Traffic offenses** under Chapters 4506, 4507, 4510, 4511 and 4549, including OVIs.
- **Sex Offenses:**
 - Rape, sexual battery, unlawful sexual conduct with a minor, gross sexual imposition, sexual imposition, pandering obscenity involving a minor, pandering sexually oriented matter involving a minor, and illegal use of a minor in nudity-oriented material or performance, importuning (if the importuning was committed on or after October 10, 2007).
 - Any of the following offenses if the victim was under 18 and the offense was committed on or after October 10, 2007: voyeurism, public indecency, compelling prostitution, promoting prostitution, procuring, disseminating matter harmful to juveniles, displaying matter harmful to juveniles, pandering obscenity, deception to obtain matter harmful to juveniles.
- Any **offense of violence**, as defined by Revised Code § 2901.01(A)(9), that is a felony or a misdemeanor of the first degree:

Attempts to Commit Offenses of Violence: An offense of violence, as defined by Revised Code § 2901.01(A)(9), includes a conspiracy or attempt to commit, or complicity in committing any of the enumerated offenses.

*** Offense-of-violence exceptions (only applies to an individual eligible under the traditional eligibility provision):** Misdemeanor Riot, Assault, Inciting to Violence, and Inducing Panic
